Definition

We don't always need to use **a**, **an** or **the** before a noun. We sometimes call this zero article or you may see it as **Ø**.

Uses

Rules for zero article	Examples	Exceptions
All continents and most countries	<p>Ø Japan is in Ø Asia and has more than 6,000 islands.</p> <p>The north coast of Ø France faces the south coast of Ø England.</p>	<p>With republic, kingdom, etc. or plurals:</p> <p>the Czech Republic the United Kingdom the Netherlands</p>
Islands	<p>Ø Ibiza, Ø Corsica and Ø Sicily are all islands in the Mediterranean.</p>	<p>With the word isle(s) or plurals:</p> <p>the Isle of Wight the Channel Islands</p>


Cities and towns	Ø Birmingham is in England.	the Hague
Mountains & lakes	Ø Lake Gwynant is 3km from Ø Mount Snowdon in North Wales.	When we don't include 'Mount': the Matterhorn the Jungfrau Groups of lakes: the Great Lakes
Names of streets	Ø Oxford Street in London has 548 shops.	the High Street [Street signs usually show High Street but we always say the High Street.]
Names of shops	Ø Sainsbury's is England's oldest supermarket and Ø Tesco is the biggest.	For a particular shop: The Sainsbury's in the High Street is open on Sundays.
Languages	Swiss people speak Ø German, Ø French, Ø Italian or Ø Romansh.	We can say: The English <u>language</u> is spoken by about 900 million people.
Places such as school, prison, hospital, church etc. when we think of them generally, not as specific buildings	Christians go to Ø church on Sundays. My son's going to Ø university. I'm at Ø work now. He takes his children to Ø school every morning. She's in Ø hospital. [staying as a patient]	the synagogue, the temple, the mosque, etc. Compare: She works in a hospital. [It doesn't matter which one.] I will go to the hospital tomorrow. [as a visitor - and we know which one.]
Names of stations, airports, etc.	You can get a train to Ø Gatwick Airport from Ø Victoria Station.	

Sport and education	<p>I like playing Ø golf.</p> <p>She's studying Ø archaeology at Manchester University.</p>
Generalisations	<p>I love Ø coffee but I don't like Ø tea.</p> <p>He reads Ø magazines about Ø cars and Ø motorbikes.</p> <p>Ø Happiness is more important than Ø money.</p>
Meals	<p>In Spain, they have Ø lunch and Ø dinner much later than in England.</p>
Other expressions	<p>I go to Ø bed at 11.00.</p> <p>I go to work by Ø bus or Ø train but never on Ø foot.</p> <p>They're on Ø holiday.</p>

Examples



My daughter is at **Ø** university [= she's a student] but she's on **Ø** holiday at **the** moment with a friend.



My husband works as a lecturer at the university. [We know which one]



I love listening to Ø music...



but I don't like going to Ø concerts; the music is too loud.
