

# Plural nouns with 's', 'es', and 'ies'

## Construction

The plural ending of a noun is usually **s** but it is sometimes **es**, **ies**, or irregular.

Singular noun = **1** telephone



Plural noun = **2** telephones.

<b>o</b>	tomato potato volcano	tomatoes potatoes volcanoes	<p>Words of foreign origin, including Italian words, often take 's' not 'es':</p> <p>photos zeros pianos porticos scenarios</p>




