# **Giving prices**

#### Introduction



"That's thirty four pounds fifty, please."

### **Definition**

A price is the amount of money you pay for something.

### **Construction**

We write	We say
50p or £0.50	fifty pence/fifty 'p'
50c or €0.50	fifty cents
50c or 50¢ or \$0.50	fifty cents
£25 or £25.00	twenty-five pounds
€25 or €25.00	twenty-five euros
\$25 or \$25.00	twenty-five dollars
¥25	twenty-five yen
£25.45	twenty-five (pounds) forty-five (pence)
€25.45	twenty-five (euros) forty-five (cents)
\$25.45	twenty-five dollars and forty-five cents or
4-5115	twenty-five forty-five
£25,000 or £25k	twenty-five thousand pounds
£25m	twenty-five million pounds
Note that this is similar for other currencies.	

Note that we use a full stop to separate pounds and pence; euros and cents etc. We use a comma to separate thousands.

£5,200.50 Five thousand two hundred pounds fifty pence

## **Examples**



"How much is a single room with breakfast?" "Eighty-five euros per night."



"How much does a new Smart car cost?" "About nine thousand pounds."
