Possessive pronouns



This is my yoghurt. This yoghurt is mine.

We use a possessive pronoun instead of a noun to indicate possession.

This file is Sophie's. This file is hers.

We use an apostrophe with a noun to indicate possession but never with a pronoun.

This is Sue's.

This is hers. ✓

This is her's.



Personal pronoun	Possessive adjective	Possessive pronoun
1	my	mine
you	your	yours
he	his	his
she	her	hers
it	its	its
we	our	ours
they	their	theirs

Uses **Examples**

To replace a name and a noun	It is Jeremy's computer. It is his. his = Jeremy's computer	
To replace a possessive adjective and a noun	These are their books. These are theirs. theirs = their books	
As a subject complement	The one on the left is mine and the other one is yours.	
As a subject	Ours is the red car and theirs is the blue one. His is in the car park.	



This is my dinner. Yours is in the microwave.



Tom has a problem with his laptop so he's using mine today.



Do you prefer ours or theirs?
