Definition

We use the prepositions 'in', 'on' and 'at' to talk about time.

Uses

Uses		Examples
in	months	in January, in February...
	seasons	in (the) spring, in (the) summer, in (the) autumn, in (the) winter
	parts of the day	in the morning, in the afternoon, in the evening [but not 'night']
	years	in 2013
on	days	on Monday(s), on my birthday, on Christmas day, on Easter Sunday
	dates	on 12th August, on the 23 rd

at	times of the day	at 4 o'clock, at midday, at 2.30, at bedtime, at lunchtime
		at night
	with 'night'	
		at the weekend, at weekends ['on' the weekend - US]
	with 'weekend'	
		at Christmas, at Easter, at Ramadan
	festivals
