

# Prepositions of time: in, on, at

## Introduction



My birthday is **in** April.

## Definition

We use the prepositions 'in', 'on' and 'at' to talk about time.

## Uses

Uses		Examples
in	months	<b>in</b> January, in February...
	seasons	<b>in</b> (the) spring, in (the) summer, in (the) autumn, in (the) winter
	parts of the day	<b>in</b> the morning, in the afternoon, in the evening [but not 'night']
	years	<b>in</b> 2013
on	days	<b>on</b> Monday(s), on my birthday, on Christmas day, on Easter Sunday
	dates	<b>on</b> 12th August, on the 23 <sup>rd</sup>

at	times of the day	at 4 o'clock, at midday, at 2.30, at bedtime, at lunchtime
	with 'night'	at night
	with 'weekend'	at the weekend, at weekends ['on' the weekend - US]
	festivals	at Christmas, at Easter, at Ramadan
