Introduction



Jeremy is my friend. Do you know **him?**

Definition

An object pronoun is the object of a verb. We use it when we don't need to mention or repeat the noun.

me
you
him
her
it
us
them

Uses

Compare object pronouns with subject pronouns:

Subject pronouns	Object pronouns
I like Kim.	Kim likes me.
You like Kim.	Kim likes you.
He likes Kim.	Kim likes him.
She likes Kim.	Kim likes her.
It likes Kim.	Kim likes it.
We like Kim.	Kim likes us.
They like Kim.	Kim likes them.

Examples



My friends are at the restaurant with **me.**



Can I offer **you some coffee?**



This is Joe Brown. I work with **him in the sales department.**



Sue is our manager. We have a meeting with **her every week.**



My new office is in Paris. I love **it.**



These are my colleagues. I like **them.**
