## Introduction

## Definition

An object pronoun is the object of a verb. We use it when we don't need to mention or repeat the noun.

**me**  
**you**  
**him**  
**her**  
**it**  
**us**  
**them**

## Uses

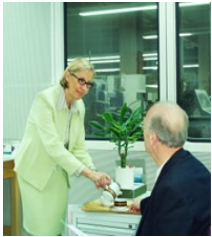
Compare object pronouns with subject pronouns:

Subject pronouns	Object pronouns
<b>I</b> like Kim.	Kim likes <b>me</b> .
<b>You</b> like Kim.	Kim likes <b>you</b> .
<b>He</b> likes Kim.	Kim likes <b>him</b> .
<b>She</b> likes Kim.	Kim likes <b>her</b> .
<b>It</b> likes Kim.	Kim likes <b>it</b> .
<b>We</b> like Kim.	Kim likes <b>us</b> .
<b>They</b> like Kim.	Kim likes <b>them</b> .

## Examples



My friends are at the restaurant with **me**.



Can I offer **you** some coffee?



This is Joe Brown. I work with **him** in the sales department.



Sue is our manager. We have a meeting with **her** every week.



My new office is in Paris. I love **it**.



These are my colleagues. I like **them**.
