

Definition of a quantifier

Quantifiers

Quantifiers are a kind of **determiner**. They can consist of a single word or a phrase. They are used with countable or uncountable **nouns** to give information about quantities or amounts. Here are some examples:

all	much	either	few	some	each
no	many	neither	little	any	every
none	a lot of	both	something	anyone	nowhere

Determiners

Determiners are used in front of nouns to give us more information. There are different kinds, including **articles**, **numbers**, **demonstratives**, **quantifiers** and **possessive adjectives**. For example:

I have **two** children. **My** daughter is six and **my** son is four.

I like **this** book; it has **a lot of** information about **the** city.
