

# Some, any

## Introduction



"I'd like **some** croissants, please." "Sorry, we don't have **any** today."

## Definition

**Some** and **any** are quantifiers.

## Construction

|                          | Some                            | Any                                  |
|--------------------------|---------------------------------|--------------------------------------|
| Affirmative              | I have <b>some</b> money.       | ✗                                    |
| Negative                 | ✗                               | I don't have <b>any</b> money.       |
| Interrogative            | Do you need <b>some</b> money?  | Do you have <b>any</b> money?        |
| Singular countable nouns | ✗                               | ✗                                    |
| Plural countable nouns   | We have <b>some</b> books.      | We don't have <b>any</b> books.      |
| Uncountable nouns        | I need <b>some</b> information. | I don't have <b>any</b> information. |

## Use

We use **some** and **any** to talk about quantities and amounts - not large and not small.

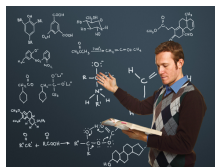
## Examples
